THE ECOSYSTEM OF OUR COMMUNITY:

Education through STEAM & Adaptability

FY24 marked a significant evolution in Arts & Scraps' programming, building upon the foundation laid in FY23. Aiming for a deeper, more lasting impact on the communities we serve, Arts & Scraps transitioned from offering primarily one-time workshops and events to providing 6 to 12-week extended programs focused on fostering meaningful, ongoing relationships with students and communities. This shift emphasizes long-term engagement, with a primary focus on serving communities within the City of Detroit.

Our programs are designed around STEM curricula, thoughtfully aligned with state standards. Clients and partners are offered a variety of distinct curriculum tracks, each focused on specific topics or units. Central to our approach is an emphasis on open-ended, creative learning experiences that encourage critical thinking, problem-solving, and creativity-skills that foster a lasting enthusiasm for learning.

Arts & Scraps' programming unfolds as a dynamic and engaging journey, aimed not only at academic development but also at nurturing social and emotional growth, fine motor skills, and creativity. Our curriculum remains aligned with meeting the diverse needs of our students. We extend our programs across schools, community organizations, after-school initiatives, and community centers, with a strong focus on Detroit's vibrant communities.

Our commitment is clear: to provide high-quality educational programming that sparks creativity and imagination in the young minds we serve. This report highlights the positive impact we've made, and we look forward to continuing our work, expanding our reach, and furthering our mission in the near future.

OUR REUSE FUEL: VOLUNTEERS

Tales from Arts & Scraps' Engine

While the physical warehouse is no longer, our Operations Team continues it's work to fuel our mission. With our recent transition from three buildings to two, our team has thoughtfully reimagined how we use our space and materials, making sure that every step of our work is as efficient as possible. We are not a storage company, we are a Creative Reuse organization. Since our Operations Team manages our volunteer groups, bulk donated materials, program and kit supplies, as well as the operational needs of our buildings and staff, there is always more to do. Our goal remains utilizing as many materials as possible to resource our community.

Our relationship with Rocket Mortgage gave us the opportunity to distribute our kits to students across Detroit through grant support and volunteerism. Throughout FY24, we have resourced our community with over 4000 kits without any cost to the nonprofits, schools, libraries and community changers.

Naturally, none of this would have been possible without our volunteers; in FY24, we worked with over 1400, either in-house or in the community. Each volunteer makes a difference, whether they come once, or many times. One volunteer broke an Arts & Scraps record with over 100 occurrences and over 300 volunteer hours within the year. We are grateful for every volunteer and organization that has fueled our mission!

The Detroit Community Store

Tucked away on Detroit's Eastside, our community has an absolute hidden gem— the Arts & Scraps Detroit Community Store.

Arts & Scraps stands tall with murals, mosaics, and sculptural pieces adorning our building and surrounding area. Inside our Community Store, you'll find endless creative materials, all donated by community members and partners. Each day brings forth new treasures, filling our bins with fresh wonders waiting to be explored. The public can come and shop in our beloved 'fill a bag' section for our most predictable items, like fabric or beads. What makes Arts & Scraps unlike anyplace else is that they can also hunt through our more untraditional art items, like stained glass materials, old photographs, and unexpected surprises in our individually priced section.

There's more to our store than mere shopping. We also have a multi-use classroom stocked with creative materials and inspiration. This adaptable classroom space allows us to connect with our community in many ways. Our volunteers use this space to process the materials for our educational kits and maintain the store's sorting and organizing. Our Creative Café Meet Ups host community creative groups with a coffee shop and creative project. All year long, this space remains open to the public for our customers and community members to use while shopping and building projects with us. With every visit to our store, there is a new possibility for exploring what drives your creativity through reuse.

JANICE'S STORY

Janice is a well-known storyteller and creative educator within the City of Detroit, as well as a longtime supporter of the Detroit Community Store. While interacting with the community, she always finds a way to tie every project back to resources from Arts & Scraps.

Recently, Janice asked for our help with building a traveling shadow puppet stage. After receiving donated materials from Arts & Scraps, she made an unconventional shadow puppet stage out of an embroidery lap stand. At the same time, Arts & Scraps was asked by a local preschool for a reference for puppet enrichment. The school knew we would know someone, and we knew Janice was the perfect person to call. We connected the two, and thier impcat continues!

Janice has continued to work with the school children creating a puppet show workshop. She continues to come back and share her stories of her student's joy with us when she visits for more materials.

KATIE'S STORY

We live in a world where "craft" is split: one direction values fine craftsmanship; the other celebrates "arts and crafts," associated with preschoolers, glitter glue, and hobbyists. Arts & Scraps embraces the latter, creating spaces for the skilled and unskilled public to learn, share, grow, and care for each other and the environment.

As an Arts & Scraps Instructor, I've seen kids lose teeth, improve reading, learn math, develop interests, and take on responsibilities like cleaning and helping. These activities become extraordinary as kids return, building relationships, exploring creativity, and having fun. Drawing from Black Mountain College pedagogy, Arts & Scraps uses art to empower children, teaching decision-making and democracy.

In a consumer-driven society, Arts & Scraps shifts focus from consumption to creativity, fostering problem-solving and reuse. It's magical to see kids make shadow puppets and negotiate over



materials or perfect designs. They link creations to lessons on environmental issues like penguins threatened by climate change or facts about the prehistoric Giant Penguin.

Through reducing, reusing, and recycling, kids confront ecological crises and environmental racism. Post-pandemic, organizations like Arts & Scraps offer materials and the critical thinking needed for the future.

BUILDING THE FUTURE IMPACT OF ARTS & SCRAPS: Creativity, Innovation, and Technology

Since 2020, Arts & Scraps has been fortunate to build a close partnership with DPL Foundation, (formerly Detroit Public Library Foundation), What began with funding our 9,500 creative supply kits distributed throughout the pandemic, led to deep relationship, capacity building, partnership on programming, and more.

When asked where Arts & Scraps could build it's biggest impact going forward, Ang Adamiak answered "Building a Youth Development Initiative", and DPLF answered the call. Through partnership with their existing program, "CODE: Grow", Arts & Scraps will begin the process of building an initiative for 6th-12th graders to add to our existing programs.

FY24 cemented the commitment to Arts & Scraps' capacity building, and FY25 will begin our 3 year \$75,000 partnership. By FY26, we hope to have our first programming for 6th and 7th graders. From there, we will add 2 grades each year until we are serving all. This commitment will kick-start our capacity building over the next 5 years.

We are thankful for DPL Foundation's commitment, as well as the vision to move us toward deeper impact with many partners, old and new.









FINANCIAL SNAPSHOT

Arts & Scraps maintains a multipronged approach to income, believing both earned and unearned income help us build a path towards a sustainable organization. We continue to grow our donor and grant base, as we believe that will help us reach increased impact.



Overwhelmingly, our staff create our impact, so we invest in them in return. At a ratio of 1/100, our staff multiply our work through and with volunteers to reach our community. This year, we are proud to invest over \$22,000 into artists and partners even smaller than Arts & Scraps.
